

Anchor Academy Board /Authority Authorized (BAA) Courses

All of the courses listed below have been authorized by the Anchor Academy Board for high school elective credit. British Columbia students are required to earn 28 or more elective credits (plus a minimum 52 non-elective course credits) in order to earn the BC Dogwood Diploma (high school graduation). The number in brackets following each course name indicates the credits allotted upon successful completion of the course.

NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY 10 [4 credits]

This course has been developed to support and encourage students to explore the richness and diversity of the New Testament. Students will gain a general knowledge of the content of the New Testament, and explore the culture, history, religions, and politics at the time of writing. Through the Gospels, historical, pastoral, prison, and apocalyptic books, the students will gain a broad understanding of the overall message and purpose of the New Testament. The various teaching strategies will encourage the development of critical thinking skills and provide a meaningful method for understanding the message and interacting with their peers.

OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY 10 [4 credits]

This course gives the students knowledge and understanding of the Old Testament. It prepares them to lead studies on their own of the Old Testament. Also, it enables them to discuss the intent and literary devices found throughout the different books and writing styles of the Old Testament. It looks in-depth at each book, who it was written by, and for what purpose.

DISCIPLESHIP 11 [4 credits]

Students enrolled in Discipleship 11 will learn valuable lessons on personal spiritual growth from a Bible-based faith perspective. Students will develop skills in biblical study, personal devotions, corporate worship, prayer, leadership, and personally sharing their faith. Students will also develop an understanding of religious diversity and how they can effectively live their expression of faith in society.

INTRO TO BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW THINKING 11 [4 credits]

“My people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge.” Hosea 4:6

This course has been developed to encourage students to develop a worldview congruent with the Bible. This course of study is designed to prepare students to resist the various deceitful philosophies that are being marketed through our mass culture. It does this by laying down the foundational principles of a biblical worldview, the crux upon which each of the five units is built. This course helps prepare students to overcome the major challenges facing youth today, to understand the times and know what to do. Ultimately, this course is uniquely designed to guide students into an encounter with biblical ideas.

NEW TESTAMENT CHURCH HISTORY 11 [4 credits]

This course gives students knowledge and understanding of the history of the church. It takes the student through the ages before Christ to the present day, first looking at the prophecies

and the purpose of the Jews. Then the students will study the creation of the church, its ups and downs, and its progress and persecutions. Finally, the student is brought to the present day by studying the different church movements and emphasis that have been prevalent.

GENESIS AND REVELATION 12 [4 credits]

This course gives students knowledge and understanding of the book of Genesis and the book of Revelation. The 2 students will be challenged to read the books with new insight. They will study closely the different time periods in Genesis and how that shaped who we are today. They will also look closely at the prophecies of the Revelation to see how they apply to us today as well as they point us forward to what will be.

LIFE OF CHRIST 12 [4 credits]

This course is designed to open the student to the life of the Saviour. It will cover the background of the Gospels and the world as it was in Christ's day. It will look at the Jews and their habits and characteristics. The course will cover all aspects of Christ's life, ministry, death and resurrection. This course will greatly increase the student's understanding of the gospels.

MISSIONS TRIP 12 [4 credits]

Students enrolled in Missions Trip 12 will learn invaluable lessons on reaching out to a culture other than their own. Students will develop skills in practical planning, mission preparation, teamwork, relationships, evangelistic outreach, communication and cultural awareness. Students will also learn the importance of sharing the hope of the Gospel of Christ and understanding cultural diversity. Finally, students will learn to help others in compassionate service and they will gain a deeper appreciation of living in a first world country.
