PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Anchor Academy's 39th year of operation. The school is an independent Provincial Online Service Provider (POLSi) that provides K – 12 education with a biblical perspective. Anchor Academy was founded by Howard and Eileen Hunt in 1986 to educate children at home with the goal of loving and serving Jesus Christ.

Anchor Academy offers 3 choices of home-schooling programs: the Online Program which follows the Ministry of Education learning requirements for each grade, Homeschool Registered where parents choose how to educate their children, and the International Program which follows the ACE schedule with specific learning PACEs for each grade. The Online Program is divided into two types of online school programs for K-12: Teacher-directed (teacher chooses the resources) or Individualized (where parents may choose the resources to be used and the teacher supplements the student's learning to meet provincial learning outcomes). The K-7 program has one homeroom teachers who personally teaches all the courses except language courses. This allows for parents to develop a relationship with and communicate with their child's teacher. In the grades 8 and 9 program, students begin to have different teachers for subjects which helps prepare them for high school. In our high school program or grad program, students are enrolled with specialty teachers. Course are delivered through our online portal, but within that, students have the option to choose between either textbooks and physical resources, or fully online courses.

Anchor Academy does offer options such as project-based Science classes for grade 6 and 7 students ("Moving to Mars" and "Powering and Protecting our Planet") led by our Vice Principal, Mrs. Melissa Magill and online Coding, Electrical and Orienteering camps for credits. For high school, specialized Science courses are also offered such as Forensic, Marine, and Veterinarian Science.

One area that Anchor Academy encourages is for students to be mission minded. Mission courses include an Introduction to Missions 10 (which includes a local mission trip), and Discipleship through Missions 11 (which includes a mission trip to countries such as Mexico, Brazil and Guatemala)

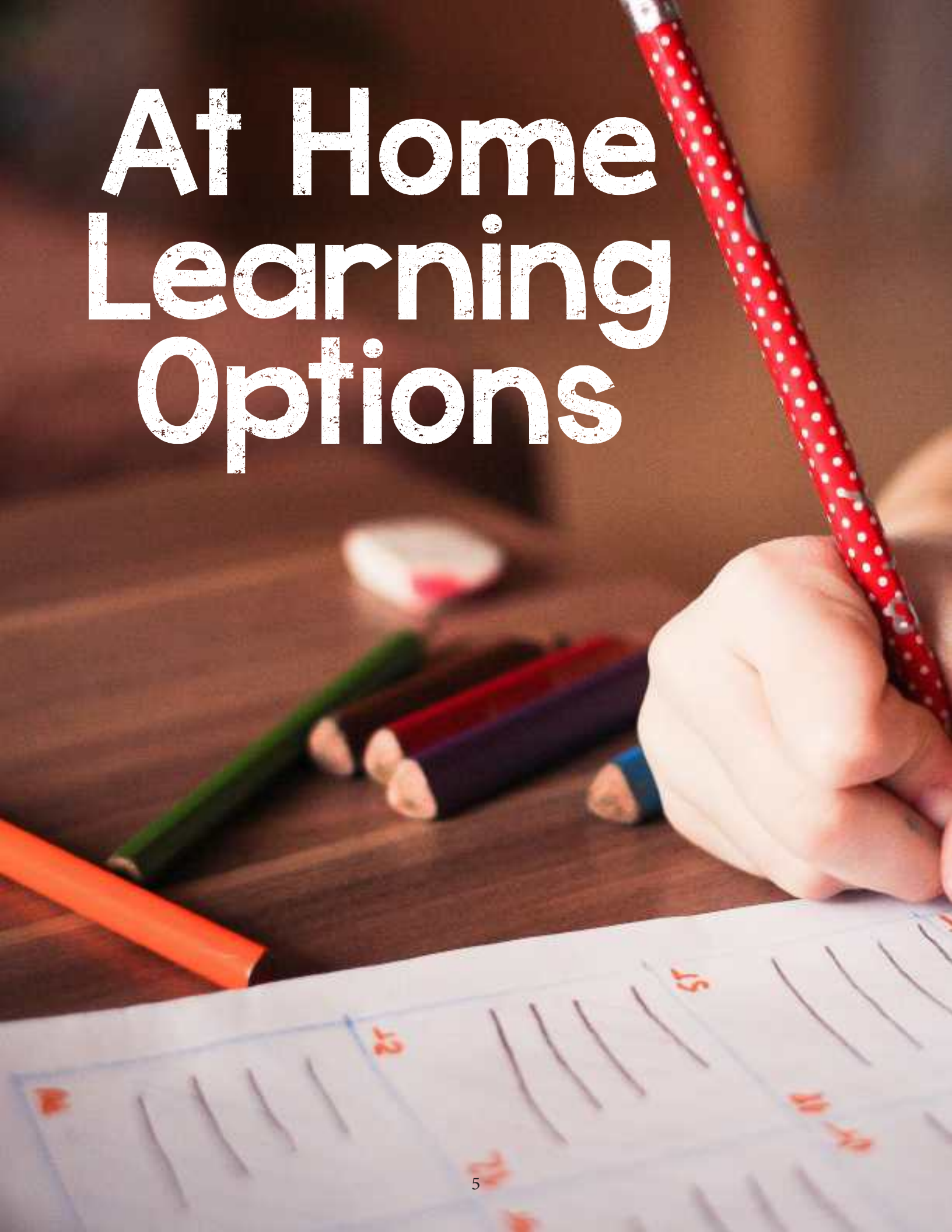

We still offer an International Program using ACE materials that follows a specific Christian Education program leading to an International Graduation Certificate.

At Home Learning Options



OPTION 1: Online Learning

Online Learning is a method of instruction where students can connect with their B.C. certified teacher using the internet, phone, or mail. Students work with B.C. certified teachers to reach goals in their learning and follow Learning Standards as prescribed by the British Columbia Ministry of Education and Child Care. This program is eligible to receive a British Columbia Dogwood Graduation Certificate.

Note: This program is only available to permanent residents of B.C.

OPTION 2: International Program

This program has limited funding (B.C. residents only) with Individualized or School designed resource choices designed on an International Diploma graduation path, (not a B.C. Dogwood diploma program).

Note: This program is available for students in B.C., in Canada, and abroad.

OPTION 3: BC Home School Registered

Parents are responsible for providing their children with an education program, however they are not required to meet the Provincial Curriculum Competencies. BC Home School Registered students are not eligible to receive a British Columbia Dogwood Graduation Certificate.

Note: This program is only available to permanent residents of B.C.

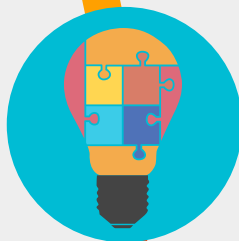
Teacher Designed (K-12)

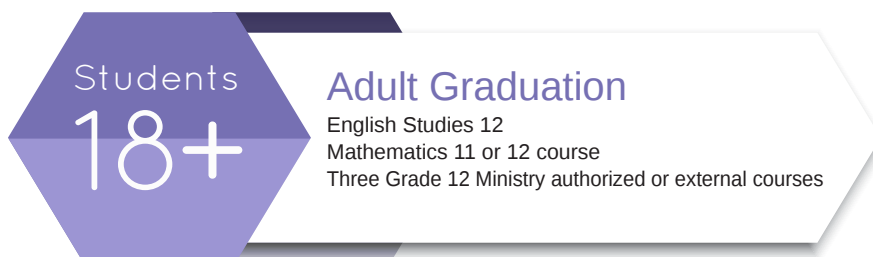

ADULT GRADUATION

Students 18 years or older may be eligible for an Adult Graduation Diploma. School aged students are eligible for full Ministry of Education funding. ONLINE LEARNING PROGRAM

Special Education K-12 & Evergreen Certificate

The goal and purpose, of the Special Education department is to support and develop each child that God brings to Anchor Academy. Each child is uniquely and wonderfully made, and Anchor Academy is honoured to work as a multidisciplinary team with each family, to grow every child academically, spiritually, physically and emotionally. While not a graduation diploma, the Evergreen Certificate recognizes the accomplishments of students who have, met the goals of an Individualized Education Plan. The Special Education team at Anchor Academy is continually adding and improving the programs and supports for all families. Listed below are some of the specialized ways Anchor Academy can support the students and their families.

PSYCHO-EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS – Anchor Academy works closely with your local psychologist to get assessments done as quickly as possible.

IEP & CMP DEVELOPMENT – The Special Education Administration Team creates and monitors the effectiveness of the Individualized Education Plans and Case Management

STRUGGLING READERS & READING PROGRAMS – Anchor Academy offers specialized programs for students with reading disorders to aid them in their academic progress.

ONE ON ONE EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT - For specifically funded students Anchor Academy can provide educational support such as:

- Life Skills/Personal Development Coaching
- Behavioral Consultation/Programming
- Grad Transitioning
- SCERTS Training- For Children with an ASD

TINYEYE THERAPIES – “TinyEye Services is a global leader in bringing online Speech-Language Pathologist and Occupational Therapy Services to schools. Providing therapy services in five languages across 12 countries, TinyEye has reached students with no access to these vital services due to geographic, social, or economic barriers.”

ONLINE TUTORING SUPPORT – support for those where it is a challenge to find in-home tutors.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Distinctive Programs

DEPRESSION & ANXIETY RECOVERY PROGRAM – This is an 8-10 week DVD series about overcoming depression and anxiety through lifestyle changes. Anchor Academy has trained individuals that facilitate Dr. Nedley’s program either online or with face to face settings where possible. This is offered on an interest basis.

MILE MATH – Anchor Academy is one of a few schools with a cutting-edge Math program that was developed by two universities. This program was specifically developed for students who have complex learning problems. Children with FASD have greatly benefited from this program.

ADHD COACHING – Strategies and weekly/bi-weekly meetings with a trained ADHD coach.

The International Program

This program is open to all families residing provincially, nationally, and globally! For families residing in British Columbia, the \$100 per student homeschool grant is available and can be applied to International Program school fees and/or curriculum purchases. Families living outside of British Columbia should contact their Provincial education authority for available funding.

FREEDOM & FLEXIBILITY

Freedom and flexibility: freedom to choose curriculum and library resources apart from the standard Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) program currently used, and flexibility in time with no limits as to how long a child works through his/her grade work. An Academic Projection (one of four graduation path options) will be prepared when your child reaches 14 years of age. This document specifies every course required for graduating with an International diploma/transcript.

ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE

Academic assistance: tutoring help is available for parent and student between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Pacific Time (Monday thru Friday). Please call 1.888.917.3783.

REPORT CARDS

A progress report will be mailed to you four times per year. If your child qualifies, annual Honour Roll Certificate will be awarded (with honourable mention in Anchor Academy's bi-monthly publication), while also earning applicable short term mission (STM) credits

ID CARDS

Free student and or home school parent/teacher photo (wallet sized) ID card. Submit passport sized photo to the Anchor office by September 30. Email photo(s) (surname first, first name second) to anchorstudentids@ark.net. Subject the email «Student ID». ID cards will be enclosed in the November/December's mail-out.

FREE TESTING MATERIALS

Reading Readiness Tests (for preschool/grade 1 children), Diagnostic Tests in English, Math, Reading Comprehension, Spelling (for grades 1-12), Canadian Achievement Tests (for grades 1-3 to post-secondary).

GRADUATION

A graduation celebration is held in May or June with a formal graduation ceremony and banquet.

BURSARIES

Anchor Academy provides opportunities for students to earn/apply for bursaries for short term missions, as well as for specified Christian post-secondary institutions.

SCHOOL FEES

Grades K - 7 = \$200 + PST annually per student
Grades 8-12 = \$300 + PST annually per student

Families enrolling more than 3 children will not be charged for the 4th and subsequent child(ren).

Full-time (faith support) missionary families are exempt from paying school fees.

CURRICULUM COST

If using Accelerated Christian Education (A.C.E.) curriculum, an approximate cost per course would be \$75 (PACEs plus borrowing of score keys).

PRESCHOOL CURRICULUM

FOURS FOR JESUS

Welcome to “FoursForJesus! “ This program is designed to help children, age 4, to prepare for Kindergarten while they grow in their knowledge of the Bible and their relationship with Jesus Christ. You will find below a brief description of the academic aspects of the program. As much as possible, the stories are found in the Bible. The songs are those which we would hear in Sunday school and at Bible camp. Wherever possible, the songs and stories relate to a concept that is in the lesson. Bible verses or phrases are also used to develop the lesson. The cost is \$50 per semester. (Please contact the teacher, Mr. Martin Fromme (1.866.380.3577), before registering to ensure that the level of parental involvement is understood.)

SUBJECTS

MATH: The children experience the numbers from zero to twenty. Although some children may be able to count beyond twenty, the primary purpose of the number content of the lesson is to get a “sense” of the numbers (e.g. “2”, double, twice, twins). In the section of shapes, students will learn that shapes have special names.

ENGLISH: Through the stories, following instructions, and expressing their thoughts and observations, the student develops skills necessary for success in English Language Arts.

SOCIAL STUDIES: Children learn about what God has done and what people have done through investigation (photographs) of landforms, development of technology, and culture.

SCIENCE: Things that God has made or what man has made are explored by the student. Parents are encouraged to expand on these groupings with books, DVDs, and internet research.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: The specific hands-on activities will help develop small motor skills. Balance and large motor skills are developed through the suggested activity.

ART: Colours and shapes are the back bone for the art component of this program. The use of various mediums of expression is also incorporated.

KINDERGARTEN WITH ACE & CHRISTI READING PROGRAM

This kindergarten program, based on phonics, features a complete scope and sequence of concepts (four volume daily instructional manuals, song CD, animal display cards, and number train cards) and skills needed to prepare K3 - K5 children to be ready to read. Sixty Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) PACEs (2000 pages) filled with animal pictures, activities, and full-colour picture stories encourage a child to want to read. They will also learn social skills, the wonders of God’s world, and the reality of God’s love. Another feature for the parent or instructor is the easy-to-use format for guiding children from pre-testing through a kindergarten graduation program. Parents may choose to purchase a new kit (phone office for up to date price) or borrow the kit from Anchor Academy. Kit rentals include the same non-consumable resource items as in the new kits. PACEs, however, are not included with the borrowed kits and will need to be ordered separately, \$3.80 + GST each (prices subject to change).

PRIMARY COURSES | INTERNATIONAL GRADE 1 Program

ABCS WITH ACE AND CHRISTI KIT

This multi-sensory, phonetic learning-to-read program is designed to prepare a child for the individualized instruction of the PACE curriculum. Within a period of 12 to 15 weeks, he/she becomes acquainted with cartoon animals, songs, and stories. These features help your young student to learn letter sounds, alphabet sequence, and word relationships. Your child is helped in his physical and character development through poems, displays, and various activities. It takes approximately 3 months to do ABCs kit! **The loaned kit contains . . . Daily Instructional Manuals I and II** (reinforces the alphabet sounds and Scripture passages support the lesson and illustrate character traits.), Diploma, Progress Reports, Song CD (reinforces letter sounds), **Animal Display Cards** (used for visual display and review), **Tactile and Kinetic Cards** (imprint the shape of the letters in the child's mind), **Post Test**. Cost to borrow kit is **\$43.60**. (If you wish to purchase a new kit to keep, please call the office for up-to-date cost information.) ~ Then order separately; 12 Word Building PACEs (1001-1012) and 3 Math PACEs (1001-1003), to be used in conjunction with the kit. You may also choose the 12 Bible Reading and 12 Animal Science elective PACEs to be used in conjunction with the stories in the kit. Once the 12 Word Building and 3 Math PACEs have been completed, it is time to order the rest of the grade 1 curriculum: Math PACEs (1004 – 1012), and 12 English, 12 Science, & 12 Social Studies PACEs (1001 – 1012). **Each PACE costs \$4.40 + GST, shipping and handling extra.**
