
STUDENTS PLANNING TO GRADUATE THIS YEAR

1) An Introduction to Geocaching Your child will learn about the GPS and use it to find hidden treasures in your community. Learn about the geographic coordinate system, the history of the GPS and the basics of geocaching. GPS units are loaned to families for the trekking challenge.



- 2) An Introduction to Electric Circuits A certified teacher teaches your child to understand the basic electric circuit, then helps them build battery projects safely with an Electricity Lab or LittleBits snap-on circuit kits. Kits are loaned to families through the AASI supply.
- 3) An Introduction to Coding and Robotics Learn how to code a simple game online and prepare them for greater coding challenges. Once the online module is complete, your child gets a chance to use that skill to program robots! Edison robots are loaned to the families through the AASI supply.
- 4) An Introduction to 3D Design & 3D Printing Learn how to design your own 3D object in TinkerCad. Designs are 3D printed and mailed home at the end of the course for them to enjoy!
